

Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

This statement is made pursuant to section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes Horbury Group's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ended 31 May 2018. Horbury supports the principles and aims of the Modern Slavery Act and confirms it has a zero tolerance approach to slavery and human trafficking and expects all of its supply chain to share these values.

The Horbury Group consists of eight companies based solely in the UK:

- Horbury Building Systems Limited;
- Horbury Joinery Limited;
- Horbury Facades Limited;
- Horbury Property Services Limited;
- Titan Interior Solutions Limited;
- Horbury South West Limited;
- Magna Plant and Tool Hire Limited;
- Environ Safety Management Limited.

The group has its head office in Rotherham and regional offices in London and Caerphilly. Our supply chain is predominantly based in the UK. We have policies and procedures in place to ensure the selection of suppliers is controlled and minimizes the risk of Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery.

All employees have a responsibility to be alert to the risks, however small, in our business and in the wider supply chain and to report concerns. We have a Whistle-Blowing policy and a formal reporting structure which supports these responsibilities and facilitates proper escalation and resolution of issues.

Horbury is committed to ensuring that neither modern slavery nor human trafficking feature in our supply chain or in any part of our businesses. We are committed to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implement and enforce effective systems and controls to, as far as practical, ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in the company's operations.

Our supply chain incorporates a limited number of preferred agencies as well as subcontract organisations. In 2018 one subcontractor declined our request to audit their operations and subsequently is no longer utilised in our supply chain. A client also raised concerns about another subcontractor which were investigated with the result that the subcontractor was found to be compliant with the relevant legal requirements. During 2019 we will continue to monitor our preferred agencies and subcontractors to give ourselves reasonable assurance that they are compliant with the Modern Slavery Act.

We ensure that our staff remain aware of modern slavery and human trafficking and their responsibilities should they have any concerns in this area by issuing periodic messaging.
